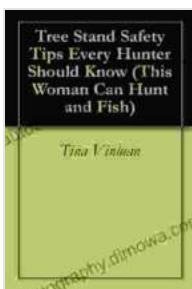


# Tree Stand Safety Tips Every Hunter Should Know

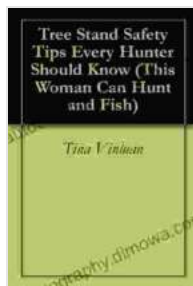
